WHO WILL BE THERE

Media advisers and scholastic journalists will converge to learn, share, compete and celebrate during the three-day convention.

Keynote Speaker Tony Plohetski is a national award-winning journalist whose work spans print, television and digital media. He has chronicled some of Texas' biggest stories, and his investigative and

accountability reporting has led to indictments and prompted new state laws and other government reform.

He joined the Austin American–Statesman in 2000, and since 2013, he has worked in partnership with KVUE, where he is the station's senior reporter. Plohetski has received more

than two dozen national and state journalism honors, including a national Edward R. Murrow Award, three National Headliner awards and the prestigious Hillman Prize in broadcasting, which honors journalists "who pursue investigative reporting and deep storytelling in the service of common good."

In 2021, he was the inaugural winner of the Dan Rather Medal for News & Guts for journalistic courage and was named Star Reporter of the Year by Texas Managing Editors, an honor for which he was twice runner-up in the past decade. Read more at taje.org.

David Knight and Scott Winter will again lead an Intensive Writing session 3 p.m. – 5 p.m. Saturday during on-site contests. Preregistration is required, and cost is \$20 per student and/or adviser.

On Sunday, advisers and pros will teach sessions covering all aspects of scholastic journalism, and on-site critiques will provide staffs with valuable feedback. Registration will be waived for teachers who volunteer by Sept. 24 for at least two activities including speaking, judging or doing on-site critiques.

Monday's featured speaker, Tamir Kalifa, is an Austinbased "visual journalist." His work has been published in The New York Times, The Washington Post, The Wall Street Journal, USA Today, The Smithsonian Magazine, The Boston Globe and The Austin American-Statesman among others.

- · Entries must be submitted online no later than 6 p.m. Sept. 23.

CATEGORIES: Sports Action, Sports Reaction, Feature, News, Portrait, First-Year Photo, Photography Portfolio

VIDEO

- \cdot Limit of two entries per school per category. Each student is limited to one entry per category.
- · Videos must have been produced after Oct. 1, 2021.
- · Entries must be submitted online no later than 6 p.m. Sept. 23.

CATEGORIES: Commentary, Commercial/PSA, News Story, Feature Story, Sports Story

New: A \$25 handling fee will be added to schools entering students in uploaded contests but not attending the convention. They must also register and pay for one student in order to compete. These entries will not count toward Sweepstakes. All other rules apply.

BEST OF SHOW At least one student from the <u>school must register for and attend Fall Fiesta to enter.</u>

Best of Show categories are **broadcast** (one show produced 10/19/21 - 10/7/22), **print news** (one issue published Oct. 19, 2021 - Oct. 7, 2022), **online news**, 2022 **literary magazines** and 2022 **yearbooks**. Depending on the number of entries, categories may be divided by size of publication or school.

Yearbooks, lit mags and print news must be turned in to the registration desk by 3 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 8. Links to broadcasts and online news publications must be uploaded via the appropriate forms at taje.org by Oct. 7.

Best of Show will be judged Saturday evening. If you will not be at the convention until Sunday and want to enter Best of Show, you must send your print publication to the TAJE address with arrival before Oct. 4. Contact *director@taje.org* if you need a street address for delivery.

Cost: \$20 per publication entered.

DO NOT bring videos to the convention.
DO NOT mail in videos.
